PM Modi visits Tamil Nadu to inaugurate and lay foundation stone of multiple projects



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi visited Tamil Nadu on 14 February, 2021, where he inaugurated and laid the foundation stones for several key projects.

PM also handed over the State-of-the-Art **Arjun Main Battle Tank** (**MK-1A**) to the Indian Army at **Chennai.**

The state- of-the-art tank, has been indigenously designed, developed, and manufactured by DRDO's Combat Vehicles Research and Development Establishment.

- Projects inaugurated includes:
 - The **Chennai Metro Rail Phase-I extension**, completed at a cost of Rs. 3770 crore
 - The fourth Railway line between Chennai Beach and Attipattu, laid at a cost of Rs.293.40 crore
 - The **Railway Electrification of single line section** in Villupuram Cuddalore Mayiladuthurai Thanjavur and Mayiladuthurai-Thiruvarur, completed at a cost of Rs. 423 crore.

Projects whose foundation stone were laid includes:

Extension, renovation and modernization of the **Grand Anicut Canal System** – cost Rs.2,640 crore.

Discovery Campus of IIT Madras – The Campus will be built at Thaiyur near Chennai at an estimated cost of Rs.1000 crore in the first phase, over an area of 2 lakh sqm.

PM Modi Visits Kerala to dedicate to the nation and lay foundation stone of multiple projects



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi was on a day long visit to Kochi in Kerala on 14 February, 2021 to lay the foundation stone and dedicate various projects to the nation. During his visit, PM laid the foundation stone of **Reconstruction of South Coal Berth at Cochin Port Trust**. The port is being reconstructed at an estimated cost of

Rs 19.19 crore under the Sagarmala Scheme.

Projects dedicated to the nation includes:

The **Propylene Derivative Petrochemical Project** (PDPP), developed by the Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) at a capital cost of about Rs 6000 crore. The complex will produce Acrylates, Acrylic Acid and Oxo-Alcohol, which are at current scenario imported from other nations.

Famous Mandu Festival Begins in Madhya Pradesh



The three-day famous "Mandu Festival" began at the historic town of Mandu in Dhar district of Madhya Pradesh from February 13, 2021. The festival will culminate on February 15, 2021.

The festival is organised by the state government of Madhya Pradesh to showcase each and every aspect of the ancient Mandu city, ranging from **food**, **music**, **history & heritage**, **art & craft etc**.

During the festival, the state culture and tourism minister Usha Thakur inaugurated the newly constructed **Dino Adventure Park and Fossils Museum** in Mandu and construction of Astro Park building at a cost of Rs 59 lakh. The Dinosaur Park is the first modern fossil park in India which has 24 eggs and other fossils of dinosaurs on display.

About SERB Women Excellence Award 2021



It is a one-time award being presented by SERB to women scientists since 2013 to support basic research in the frontier areas of science and engineering. The women scientists should be below 40 years of age. She must have received recognition from any one or more of the National Academies such as Young Scientist Medal, Young Associateship, etc. The award provides a grant of Rs. 15 lakhs for a period of three years to the awardees to pursue

their research ideas.

FinMin to infuse Rs 3,000 cr in state-owned general insurers in Q4 of FY21

The Finance Ministry will infuse Rs 3,000 crore capital into state-owned general insurance companies during the current quarter, of 2020-21, for recapitalization, to improve their financial health. The three public sector general insurance companies are: National Insurance, Oriental Insurance and United India Insurance. The capital infusion will enable these companies to improve their financial and solvency position, meet the insurance needs of the economy, absorb changes and enhance the capacity to raise resources and improve risk management.
