Human ATM



Postal department's new service of delivering money home – where postman acted as a human ATM – has turned out to be biggest hit countrywide.

More than one lakh transactions being recorded across India on a daily basis.

How does it work?

The free service allows people to withdraw through the postman — up to ₹10,000 at a time from any of their Aadhaar-linked bank accounts.

The postman carries a portable biometric device to match fingerprints. All a person needs to do is to use the Postinfo app or simply call the local post office or spot the postman.

World Lion Day to be observed virtually on August 10, 2020



World Lion Day is observed across the world on August 10 every year. World Lion Day, 2020 is being observed virtually this year due to the pandemic. The main purpose of this day is to raise awareness about lions and educate people about issues concerning their protection and conservation.

Background:

i.In 2013, Dereck and Beverly Joubert, a husband-and-wife team of Big Cat **Initiative** and National Geographic began an initiative to form World Lion Day. **Lions in India:**

Asiatic lion is one of the five big cats found in India. The other four are Royal Bengal tiger, Indian leopard, clouded leopard and snow leopard. The range of Lions in India are now restricted to Gir National Park, Gujarat.

i. The population of Big lions in India has increased substantially from 523 in 2015 to 674 in 2020.

ii.Asiatic Lion is enlisted as an **endangered species** in the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red list.

iii.It is listed in **Schedule I of Wildlife** (**Protection**) **Act 1972**, in Appendix I of Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora(CITES)

'Asiatic Lion Conservation Project'

i.It is an initiative launched by the **Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change(MoEFCC)**, Government of India in 2017 to provide safeguards to the Asiatic lion.

ii.The Project will strengthen the measures for conservation and recovery of Asiatic Lion with the help of state-of-the-art techniques, regular scientific research studies, disease management, and modern surveillance techniques.

Govt Abolished Cotton Advisory Board; Notifies Change in Status of Textiles Research Associations

Government of India vision of "Minimum Government and Maximum Governance", the Ministry of textiles has abolished it's another advisory body, Cotton Advisory Board (CAB), and notified that all eight Textiles Research Associations (TRAs) have ceased to be "affiliated bodies" of the ministry.

• Hereafter, TRAs will be **approved bodies** for conducting testing, research and developmental activities related to the textiles sector.

- Any disposal/sale/transfer of assets created out of the central government grant shall require prior specific approval of the ministry. The eight associations are:
 - 1. Ahmedabad Textile Industry's Research Association (Atira) in Gujarat
 - 2. Bombay Textile Research Association (BTRA) in Mumbai, Maharashtra
 - 3. Northern India Textile Research Association (NITRA), Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh (UP)
 - 4. South India Textile Research Association (SITRA), Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu
 - 5. Synthetic & Art Silk Mills Research Association (SASMIRA), Mumbai, Maharashtra
 - 6. Man-Made Textile Research Association (MANTRA), Surat, Gujarat
 - 7. Wool Research Association (WRA), Thane, Maharashtra

8. Indian Jute Industries Research Association (IJIRA), Kolkata, West Bengal.

Bangladesh Decided to Construct a Monument for the Indian Soldiers Killed by Pakistan in the 1971

Mozammel Haque, Bangladesh War Liberation Minister announced the decision to construct a standalone monument for the Indian Soldiers who were killed by Pakistan in 1971 Liberation War against Pakistan.

About the Monument:



The construction of the monument will coincide with the 50th anniversary of the Independence of Bangladesh.

Site:

For the construction of the monument, 3.5 acres in Ashuganj of Brahmanbaria district which shares border

with Tripura was selected by the Bangladesh Government for its historic significance in the 1971 war.

Bangladesh honours to Indian Soldiers:

i.Bangladesh felicitated posthumous awards for the Indian Soldiers and veterans of the 1971 war along with former Prime Minister Indian Gandhi and other Indians for their role in the 1971 Liberation War.

ii.Bangladesh has a National Memorial on the outskirts of Dhaka for all the Martyrs of 1971 war and the proposed memorial is solely for the Indian Soldiers.

Key Point:

India has requested Haque to initiate the translation of the book on the Liberation War in Hindi.
