
iii.3,000 women will be trained for technical and entrepreneurial skills in housing sector which focus on area such as masonry, plumbing and electrical fitting, among others.

i.The 584th meeting of the Central Board of Reserve of Board(RBI) under the




and named one of the craters as 'Sarabhai


Book "A Bend in Time: Writings by Children on the Covid-19 pandemic" by Bijal Vachharajani Released


Narendra Modi, The Prime Minister of India, addresses the nations following the flag hoisting ceremony at
